In Literacy, we practiced storytelling and script work, helping bring our characters to life. She shared a beautiful story about the festival, and we took part in hands-on activities, including painting diyas, creating rangoli-inspired art, and exploring traditional Indian clothing. We also had some fantastic parent volunteers join us this month. Macie's mom shared her knowledge about Orange Shirt Day, which helped us deepen our understanding of inclusion and reconciliation. Ben's dad, an animator, joined Miss Sona's class to teach a fun and creative lesson on 2D shapes. In Science, we will study constellations and their patterns in the night sky. In Social Studies, we will uncover Canada's identity through cultural contributions. Literacy will give us the chance to grow our paragraph writing skills, while



continuing to build phonemic awareness. Math will bring geometry and art together as we explore shapes in creative and imaginative ways.

We are looking forward to our overnight camp trip at Camp Connect in November. We will experience immersive, hand-on learning outside of the classroom and continue building our social and emotional connections. Another highlight ahead is preparing for our Jubilee showcase, where will demonstrate our learning on stage in a celebration of connects, imagination and identity. We are excited to continue growing, creating and sharing our artistic energy and adventurous spirit with you!

Year 6/7 News

As we wrapped up our first Learning Contract, *The Fabric of Us!* we deepened our understanding of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms and explored the Treaty of Grand Paix de Montréal. These lessons inspired our creative "Masks of Peace" project, where we incorporated symbols that represent peace, unity, and understanding.

In Science, we recently completed our investigation into ecosystems and climate, which gave us the chance to showcase curiosity and critical thinking as we explored the interconnectedness of our world. With that inquiry complete, we are now turning our attention to the scientific method, learning how scientists ask questions and seek answers.

Alongside these studies, we have continued to work on our Identity Quilt pieces with Ms. Christy. We selected fabrics and designs that reflect our individuality and personal stories. We cannot wait to see all of these unique panels come together to form one beautiful, collaborative quilt that celebrates our diverse community.



We are looking forward to our second Learning Contract Sometimes You Get Supplies and Sometimes You Get a Curse. We will be exploring chance and probability through real-world examples, storytelling, and movement performances on the Jubilee Auditorium Stage. We will design, question and write reflections that foster inter-generational connection, while helping us see how chance shapes our own stories.


Here's to more curiosity, collaboration, and creativity ahead as we begin this next contract together!

Year 8/9 News

We have explored cultural representations of monsters across time, place, and genre. Through literature, science, history, and contemporary issues, we investigated literal monsters - from mythological beasts to scientific oddities - as well as metaphorical monsters such as pollution and technology. We analyzed how different cultures and contexts define monstrosity and how these depictions of monsters reveal truths about our deepest fears and uncertainties. As we formed our own personal ideas of "monster", we deepened our understanding through movement and visual art.



We were honoured to welcome Wakefield Brewster, Calgary's 6th Poet Laureate (2022-2024) and renowned spoken-word artist for a week-long residency to support our poetry development. We explored personified and metaphorical monsters while creating our anthology of original poems to answer the question "What Is a Monster"?

Visual Arts with Ms. Christy

Students are working toward completing all of their beautiful collaborative art projects, and the creativity and dedication from our students have been outstanding! From the vibrant fence art installations to the expressive lino-cut teacher portraits, each piece showcases incredible skill and imagination. The murals that are beginning to appear around the school are truly transforming our spaces and reflecting the spirit of our community. Students worked diligently to design and present professional art submissions earlier this term, and it has been inspiring to see those ideas come to life in such powerful and meaningful ways.

Modern/Contemporary Dance with Ms. Jen

After practicing fall and recovery techniques, many students are now confidently practicing safe falls from standing, without the mats!

October brought a deep dive into improvisation, where students stepped out of their comfort zones to explore movement in new ways. They are channeling those discoveries into collaborative choreography, ready to share their creations in the final class this term.

High School News

English Language Arts 10 classes, along with Drama 20/30 students, attended a performance of *Romeo and Juliet* at The West Village Theatre, presented by Calgary Young People's Theatre. This unique production demonstrated how a classic work can be reimagined in fresh and timely ways, while inspiring students to see themselves as potential participants in theatrical productions.

Social Studies 20 students visited The Military Museums as part of their study of Canada and to further deepen their understanding of the First World War. Their visit included interactive workshops exploring Canada's role in shaping and being shaped by the conflict. The Rewrite History Board Game Workshop, challenged students to apply their understanding of nationalism and decision-making by reimagining historical outcomes. Students also explored the museum galleries, further connecting their learning to real-world contexts and preparing them for our upcoming Remembrance Day assembly.

High School students had a week-long residency with Wakefield Brewster, through his program Writing Change Into the World. He delivered high impact workshops across English Language Arts, Social Studies and Drama, guiding spoken word performance skills, introducing poetry to emerging writers, supporting the creation of Remembrance Day poetry, helping students interpret human rights and economic systems through creative expression, and strengthening vocal technique and monologue work. His presence ignited student voices, curiosity and courage, and we are immensely grateful for the enrichment and learning made possible through these partnerships.



Our Student Council hosted an incredible Halloween Dance where the costumes, music, and energy were unforgettable, and we are so grateful to our council members for planning such a fantastic event.

Students in Visual Art displayed their imaginative Weird Head projects and music students performed live for the student body.
