


Message from Administration




Message from Administration continued.



In Year 4/5, we are fully immersed in an exciting alien adventure. In Science, we have wrapped up our unit on astronomical phenomena and are now diving into the study of climate and weather. Through the eyes of our alien explorers we have created, we are keeping observation logs and engaging in hands-on activities to further our understanding of weather.

In Literacy, our focus is on fiction writing. Students have begun crafting their own Diary of a Wimpy Kid style stories, written from the perspective of their alien navigating and solving problems on Earth. In Drama, we are learning to embody emotions, characters and experiences which will culminate in us "becoming" their aliens for an exciting final experience!



Year 6/7 News

We are excited to invite you to our upcoming showcase, "Tune In," where we will present the culmination of our collaborative efforts in stage show production. This project has allowed us to delve into the multifaceted process of creating a performance, encompassing scriptwriting, set design, prop construction, and rigorous rehearsals. Curriculum connections are woven into our performances, demonstrating our deep understanding of various subjects through creative expression.

In Year 6 Social Studies, we have solidified our understanding of Ancient Athenian democracy, sharing our knowledge by creating engaging tableaus. In Year 7, we have conducted in-depth research into wars around the world that impacted the formation of Canada. Our Science curriculum has taken us on a journey of discovery about Earth and our surrounding universe. In Year 6 we explored the vastness of the solar system, constructing sculptural models of diverse planetary bodies. In Year 7 we investigated the Earth's geological history, focusing on the rock cycle and benefiting from guest speakers who highlighted Alberta's rich fossil heritage.



Mathematics has been brought to life through our exploration of Cartesian planes. We collaborated with our FAMMA buddy groups, applying our understanding of shapes, transformations, and rotations fostering intergrade learning and creativity.

In Year 7 English Language Arts, we recently completed our novel study of "Walking in Two Worlds," and are now developing final projects that demonstrate our understanding of the book's themes and why its important for books to address difficult topics.

In Year 6 we have been refining our writing skills, engaging in creative writing prompts inspired by visual and auditory stimuli. We have also analyzed the structure and purpose of news articles, enhancing our ability to communicate effectively.

Year 8/9 News

In March, we explored a blend of arts, literature and global awareness. We attended a captivating performance by Calgary's String Theory Music Ensemble at the Erickson Centre campus, where Baroque music was brought to life in an innovative, interdisciplinary format. Additionally, we explored the life and contributions of Johannes Kepler, the polymath who revolutionized astronomy and inspired change. Building on our experiences, we embarked on independent artistic responses that reflected our understanding of Baroque aesthetics and interdisciplinary connections. These responses spanned multiple artistic disciplines, from visual art, creative writing, dance, theatre, music composition,



film, and fibre arts, encouraging us to adopt a polymath perspective. By integrating elements of STEM, historical research, and artistic practice, we deepened our appreciation of the era's influence on contemporary thought.

In our fourth Learning Contract, "Beyond Books & Borders", we are collaborating with Visual Artist, Ms. Christy, exploring experimental design through fabric dying and making global connections through visual art and literacy. In Language Arts, our studies have focused on Alan Gratz's novel, *Refugee*, gaining insight into the struggles and resilience of displaced individuals across history, sparking discussions on empathy, understanding, and social justice.

Athletics Update

Students have been busy in badminton, both in Physical Education classes, and extra-curricular school sports. Students showcased their hand-eye coordination and communication skills, all while exemplifying wonderful sportsmanship. Recently, students have started the Scooter Hockey unit. This is a sport inspired by Sledge Hockey, which allows students to explore new methods of moving, and puts emphasis on how despite injuries or other limitations, some sports are still accessible.

From April 7 to 17, students will be participating in PE outside, so please ensure your child comes prepared for the unpredictable Calgary weather.

Our Year 7 to 9 badminton team has a month filled with tournaments, where they will get to compete against 15 other schools across the Calgary Alternative Athletics Association. We wish them luck in their upcoming competitions!

High School News

This has been a dynamic and inspiring month filled with innovation, artistry, and authentic learning experiences across our school community!

In English Language Arts 20-2, we engaged in a unique interdisciplinary project titled the Musical Locker Bento Box Experience. Rooted in the idea that music opens a window into the human experience, students began by selecting song lyrics to analyze through a poetic and literary lens. We explored figurative language, tone, theme, and symbolism before curating "bento box" style lockers filled with carefully chosen objects. Each installation served as a visual and tactile representation of the song's literary elements, encouraging us to make deep, meaningful connections between music, language, and personal interpretation.

In our first-ever Technical Theatre 15 class, we have been busy bringing stories to life through the backstage magic of theatre. Costume design took centre stage early in the month as we met with professional designer Rhonda Perry, who shared insights into how costumes convey mood, character, and context. Inspired by steampunk aesthetics—a blend of Victorian fashion and industrial innovation we went on to design and construct our own one-of-akind hats. Using techniques like distressing, layering, and upcycling found materials, each piece reflected both creativity and craftsmanship, complete with gears, goggles, and metallic accents.

Lighting design was another exciting area of exploration. We participated in hands-on workshops with award-winning designer Narda McCarroll, experimenting with flashlights, gels, gobos, and miniature sets (maquettes) to better understand how light influences atmosphere on stage. A field trip to Theatre Calgary offered us the rare opportunity to work with Cathy Crumb, head of lighting, where we practiced focusing stage lights for dramatic effect and learned firsthand about the intricacies of lighting design. A behind-the-scenes tour of the Max Bell Theatre took us 70 feet above the stage into the fly system—an unforgettable glimpse into the technical

As we look ahead we are excited to apply our new skills for the upcoming High School showcase drama production of *Leaving Iowa* at the Vertigo Theatre, where we will play a key role in shaping the mood and magic of the show from behind the scenes.
