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



## Year 6/7 News





## Year 8/9 News



We have kicked off our final Learning Contract of the school year, the Farmers Market! In this lively contract, we are exploring fresh and saltwater systems, Aztec culture, and economic systems while creating our own products to "sell" at our Aztec Farmer's Market and living statue museum. In Year 8, we are researching ancient market goods and creating displays for our products to be "sold". In Year 9, we have teamed up with Year 8 students, creating a marketing campaign for the creations. Students in Year 4 to 7 will "shop" at the market using cocoa beans on June 14.

#### Year 8/9 News Continued.

In Year 9, we completed our first PAT in English and have been working tirelessly in preparation for our other PATs in June. We are eagerly anticipating our Grad Ceremony and Celebration on June 5 and 6. We are looking forward to our next adventure, high school!

## **High School News**

In Science 10, we began our environmental science unit (also referred to as the climate unit) by learning about Earth's radiation budget. We learned how greenhouse gasses, albedo, the Earth's angle of inclination, and the angle of incidence of the Sun's energy impacts the radiation budget. We also discussed how the Earth's angle of inclination and the resulting angle of incidence throughout the year causes the seasons. Additionally, we discussed how climates determine the various terrestrial biomes on Earth and learned how we can analyze the climate in various locations with climatographs.

In Chemistry 20, we have been learning to solve stoichiometry problems including solutions. We have explored limiting and excess reactants and their impact on the theoretical yield. Additionally, we performed reactions to produce various pigments that can be used for painting. We weighed the pigments we produced and used the data to calculate the percent yield of our reactions. Then, we put our paints to the test by creating our own artistic masterpieces in Chem class!



In Math 10-3, we studied surface area measurements and practiced measurement conversions by completing a cake baking and decorating challenge. Afterwards, we thoroughly enjoyed our equations by eating the cake because the best way to learn is with a full stomach!

#### High School News Continued.

In English Language Arts we dove into the wonderful world of Shakespeare! We played with language by translating many of our school signs into Elizabethan English. We learned about the structure of Shakespeare's sonnets and applied our understanding of his poetic writing to our reading of his comedy A Midsummer Night's Dream.

In Year 12, we enjoyed a visit from board member Josh Dalledone who helped us complete our Leadership in the Arts course by exploring the important role the arts play in the economy.
