# 5. **Principal's Report** – Kimberly Hoey (Principal) Update from all three campuses:

First off, I just want to thank council and I love the new look of the newsletter. It looks great! I want to give another nod to Council again for all the family Halloween dances. All 3 campuses hosted them and welcome the opportunity to foster strong community spirit. Kids enjoyed the decorations all week at Knob Hill thanks to Council.

Erickson Centre demonstrated strong leadership and planning as they prepared and hosted their dance.

Reminder to everybody we are moving to a 2-report card model. We have been 3 terms before. Report cards will come end of January and end of June. Modified format: now provide feedback and assessment in all curricular areas, and we will continue to offer meaningful and individualized narrative comments. Report cards still framed by the Circle of Courage though our assessment language has changed and these changes have been made in an effort to be more transparent and specific when reporting on student achievement. This new language for assessment is also being used in our learning contract (developing, achieving, and excelling). Our high school students will continue to receive percentage grades, and their marks are updated in power school regularly. All families have received or should receive soon, feedback celebrating and sharing your child's learning from their first learning contract.

Thank you for supporting extension projects, the numeracy and literacy tasks. We see so many great things coming in from families working with kids and connecting their learning from here at home. We are hosting parent/teacher conferences later this month. These provide an opportunity to connect with your child's teacher about their academic and personal growth and progress and next steps as a learner. Watch for a sign up genius from your child's homeroom teacher.

CAA Staff had the opportunity to attend the Bi-Annual Charter School Conference hosted by the Alberta Association of Public Charter Schools (otherwise known as TAAPCS) we went to Almadina Charter School. The Charter School community is certainly growing over the 20 years I have been a part of it. So many gifted educators within our schools that have the opportunity to learn and grow together is really valuable. We are continuing to focus our staff learning numeracy and literacy practices, new curriculum, democratic discipline, indigenous ways of knowing and inclusive education.

We recently welcomed an educator from the Jump Math program to our KH and RC campus. Gail James offered feedback and ideas to strengthen our numeracy program and instruction. Gail observed numeracy lessons and has provided insight to teachers individually and has recommended strategies for our whole school community. We look forward to reflecting and implementing next steps.

Lost and Found. It is growing and overflowing at KH and RC. If you are missing something, it is here, come and find it. We will be bagging it up and donating it so please come check it out.

Juleta gave all parents of younger kiddos hope that this eventually changes once they are in High School!

All K-12 students have started preparing for Jubilee performances highlighting our school theme, The Art of Community. We ask that all students attend this performance. It is the evening of December 1st. Information packages have been emailed out about ticket sales and timeline of events – Please watch your email.

Our Developmental Assest of the month is Boundaries and Expectations. Last month focused on Support. Developmental assets is one of the pillars of our school. If you are looking to learn more about it as it is a tremendous program. It is research based out of the Search Institute. We have shared resources in the monthly email for you to facilitate conversations at home.

All students have been working with the wellness, mental health curriculum provided through Open Parachute again. That's just funding for this year. There is a parent piece if it, and it is only available to is for the remainder of this year.

Remembrance Day observances tomorrow (November 8) where each campus will have a Remembrance Day assembly and will engage in reflection and art. # Lev's Update:

Jubilee rehearsals are in full swing. Our creative writing and dance students have been working on staging the piece while visual art students have been making art show behind the dancers. Media Art students have also been working on some animations to go with that and music students, which is me. We have been arranging and practicing our 4 songs that we will play live. Student Council also held the Halloween Dance at EC, which was a major success. 50 students attended.

We have also been having lots of post-secondary information sessions with the University of Alberta, University of Lethbridge, MRU and other Universities, all coming to speak to us. Individual academic, advising sessions with all Year 12 students are being held with Ms. Baker in the upcoming months.

We also had a lovely interdisciplinary learning week, in which we asked the question, how do we ensure access to clean drinking water in indigenous communities and reservations? We explored this question, using our problem solving model, created product designs and policy pitches.

We also had the privilege of welcoming 2 guest speakers into our classrooms during that week, one being an indigenous speaker from Treaty 6. Territory, Mario Swampy.

There will also be a high school information for current and new families on November 8. It was very helpful for me to go last year, so I definitely encourage any families to go.

Our high school, New York Arts and culture trip is going ahead. It's a very exciting opportunity for all high school students. And so far 15 families have registered – that is definitely something to look forward to.

High School lunch store opens next week, which will just be like a place to buy snacks, fruit, bagels, and stuff. The store is cash only. If you have a kid in high school, make sure to remind them to bring some cash next week.

Hi, I'm Siobhan, daughter's Josephine. She is at Knob Hill but I'm wondering with the projects of understanding, healing, and indigenous communities was remediation projects, and nurturing the land to be clean enough to drink the water again. A part of it bringing in beaver systems and understanding normal activated charcoal that can be used from harvesting fire, fire, charcoal, and stuff like. Was that a part of it? Or was that like infrastructure and a little bit more like city, planning style of project

Aspects of it. More like indigenous ways of knowing and focusing specifically with like groundwater treatment. And we looked at some smaller ways of treating water and larger systemic ways. But we mostly focused on the scientific aspects of it. And what actually happens to contaminate the water that is, in indigenous reservations, because that is part of our high school curriculum. So it was largely connected to both our social studies and 11 and 12, their science curriculums. So, understanding that infrastructure is usually the greatest pollutant and actually nurturing headwaters. And natural filtration systems, like moss and trees, are filtration within, like the actual ground that's one of the main things we were looking at is natural filtration through like sand, charcoal rocks and stuff like that to the burden on indigenous communities. So yeah.
