#### Message from Administration Continued.

This year, our theme is Create To Connect. In a world that often seems increasingly disconnected, this year we will focus on connection, hoping to inspire every member of our community to connect with themselves, each other, and the world around them. Classrooms are places of curiosity; learning is hands-on, relational, and adventurous. Small, daily creative risks help us grow, discover new ideas, and make new connections in our learning. Inspired by the Cree concept of *Wahkohtowin* (interconnectedness and kinship), together, we nurture courage, curiosity, and meaningful connections. Wahkohtowin teaches us that every action ripples through the world around us. By caring for others and all living things, we honour our connections and help our communities grow strong and healthy.

In the days before staff welcomed students, we read the book *Everything Is*Connected by Jason Grul.

Guided by the metaphors and simplicity found in children's literature, we began to build collaborative connections as a staff.



We mapped our connections using the metaphor of a constellation, a visual representation of the people, ideas, and experiences that shape our teaching and support teams. This was a chance for staff to reflect, connect, and create something meaningful that celebrates both individuality and collective belonging. At Calgary Arts Academy, we have an important tradition of focusing on our CAA pillars in the first days of school. Intentional learning activities are offered about Democratic Discipline (giving students voice and choice while developing problem solving skills), the Circle of Courage (where students come to deepen their understanding of how Belonging, Mastery, Independence and Generosity are keys to a balanced and thriving life), Developmental Assets (a close look at all the internal and external strengths humans can develop) and Mindfulness (how to stay regulated and present through neuro-science). Students worked to create Arts Immersion projects to share with the entire CAA community at our annual Pancake Breakfast. The Pancake Breakfast is a celebration of connection and community, organized and hosted by the parent volunteers through the School Council. We want to thank School Council for organizing this annual kick-off event. This year, we welcomed upwards of 1000 community members! That is a lot of pancakes to be made and flipped, and a lot of incredible people to coordinate! We are grateful for the generous volunteer time and effort offered up to celebrate a community of budding connections.

Our Meet the Team evenings were another highlight of our first days. Thank you to the many parents, guardians, and siblings who showed up with smiles, questions, and open hearts. Those nights remind us that education is a partnership. Teachers appreciate getting to know the families of students they work with each day, and the feedback we have heard, which we know to be true, tells us these meaningful connections are already making a difference. Knob Hill campus families had a special, digital Meet the Team as the building is still humming with construction workers each evening. Soon, the exterior renovations will be complete, and evening events will be able to be resumed. Remember, CAA staff are always keen to connect with parents/guardians. 
### Message from Administration Continued.

We created drama skits to engage with the problem solving technique and Democratic Discipline. We also worked collaboratively with students in Year 8/9 to discover how our choices affect our daily lives, which was an impactful way to learn about Development Assets.

To celebrate, we made bracelets for every student to share at the pancake breakfast. Each bracelet had a charm that encouraged them to find a buddy with a matching one. This helped us feel more connected across our campuses and different grade groups.



# Year 6 to 9 Arts Options

We are thrilled to launch our Arts Options Program for the 2025-2026 school year!

Families have already received an email outlining this year's exciting lineup and were asked to submit a Google Form with their selections thank you to everyone who has done so. Our first options classes will begin on Monday, September 8, and students are eager to see which options they will be starting with.

#### Session 1 Options

Music (Fall) – Mr. Thorson

Students will have the opportunity to form a band with their choice of voice, strings, percussion, or wind instruments. Together and individually, they will foster self-expression, creativity, and communication through music-making. Students will strengthen their musical fundamentals, develop ensemble skills, and work toward collaborative music projects and performances throughout the term.

Note: Students enrolled in this option will participate in Music for the full duration of Term 1 (both Session 1 and 2). Interested students may also request a full year of Music.

#### Arts Options Continued.

#### Collaborative Art & Mixed Media – Ms. Christy

In this option, students will explore the power of collaboration through a wide range of mixed media practices. From large-scale murals to outdoor fence installations, weaving projects, and repurposed material creations, students will design and build meaningful works of art that extend beyond the classroom. Together, we will experiment with painting, weaving, sculpture, and innovative uses of recycled materials while developing teamwork, problem-solving, and creative risk-taking. These projects will not only brighten our school but also inspire joy within our greater community.

### Modern/Contemporary Dance – Ms. Jen

This modern/contemporary dance class invites students to strengthen their technique while exploring authentic movement to support creativity in choreography. Dancers will practice foundational skills, including alignment, flow, and dynamic use of space, while engaging in improvisation and movement exploration to develop personal expression. The class nurtures both technical growth and artistic voice, empowering students to bring originality and confidence to their dancing.

Found Object Printmaking – Ms. Haidl In this option, students will explore a variety of printmaking techniques using natural and found materials for inspiration. They will experiment with layering, transparency, and unconventional materials to discover how these processes affect their final prints. Along the way, students will develop their own artistic style while applying concepts of colour mixing and shape language in creative and practical ways.

Creative Writing – Ms. Deabler

Get ready to unleash your imagination! This workshop-based class is all about experimenting with language, sharing ideas, and discovering your unique voice as a writer. Students will craft original stories, swap ideas with peers, and learn how to give (and receive!) meaningful feedback. From world-building to dialogue, the focus will always be on what excites each student most as a storyteller. Let's get writing!


### Year 8/9 News

We have spent our first eight days of school building new friendships and strengthening old ones! Inspired by David Attenborough-style documentaries like Planet Earth, we created our own parody: The Life of a Pancake. From writing and filming, to costumes, props, acting, and editing, we worked collaboratively to produce a hilarious and creative take on how a pancake comes into existence and the "ingredients" it needs.

We are now excited to begin our first contract: What is a Monster? An Exploration of the True Monsters Within, Around, and Beyond. In this contract, we will explore how monsters have been represented across cultures, time periods,



and genres. Through literature, science, history, and contemporary issues, we will examine both literal monsters—such as mythological beasts and scientific oddities—and metaphorical ones, including pollution and technology.



In recognition of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on September 30, Calgary Arts Academy will hold campus-wide assemblies on September 29. As school will not be in session September 30, we will gather as a community to reflect and honour the importance of truth and reconciliation.

# **High School News**

We kicked off the school year with a creative project inspired by our school theme "Create to Connect." Our homerooms worked together to design an abstract representation of our class identity on canvas circles, using colours, symbols and imagery to reflect our unique individuality.
